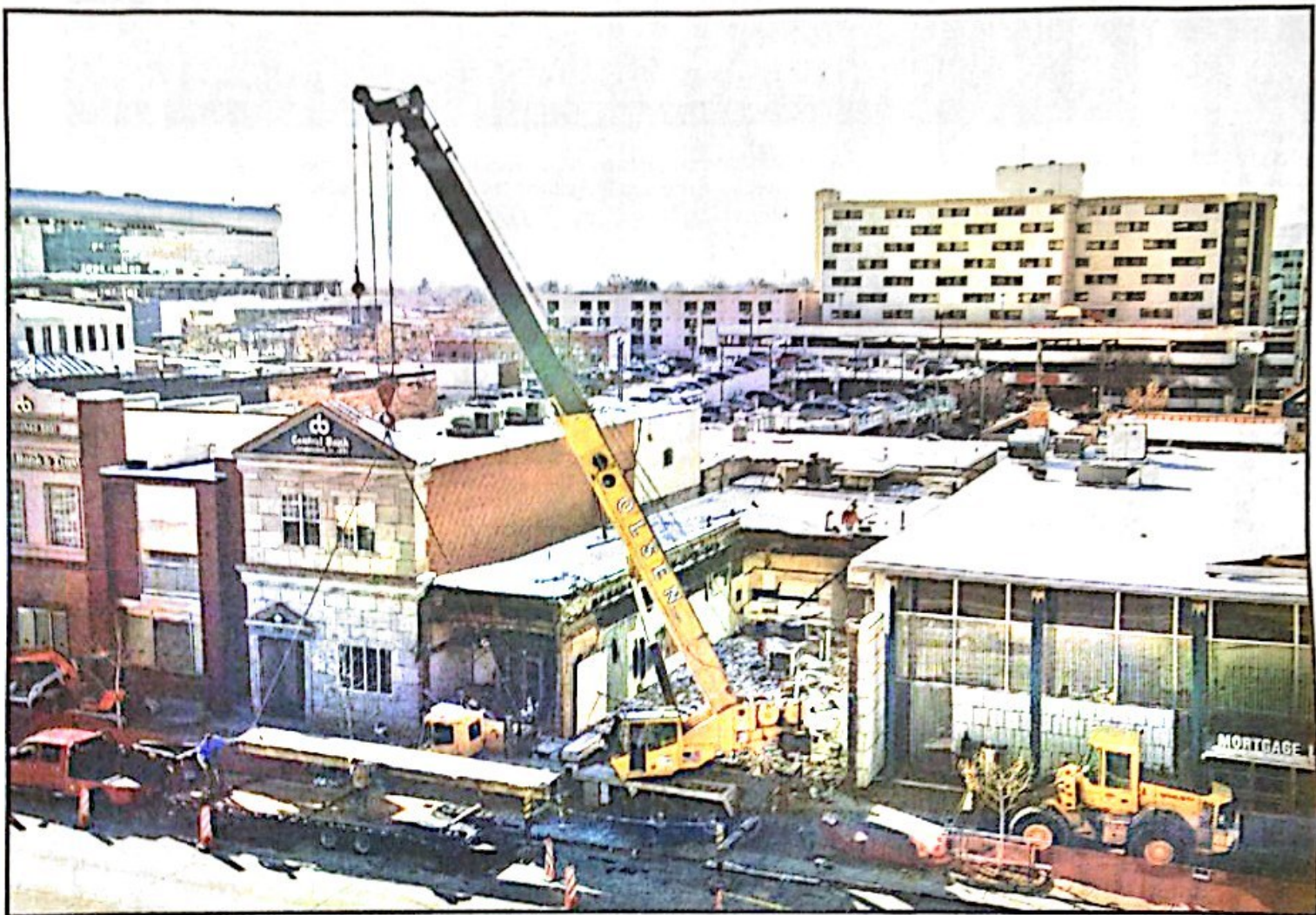

Central Bank demolished in preparation for new building

With only the sidewalk and shoulder closed on University Avenue, construction crews had little room to maneuver as demolition and renovation of the Central Bank Building in Provo began on Tuesday.

Using a crane, workers from Randall Cloward Builders lifted huge steel beams out of the roof structure and spun them around,

dropping them onto a waiting flatbed without impeding traffic flow only feet away.

While work is still in early stages, a rendering of the planned structure suggests an updated but classic look that blends with the existing brick buildings on the block. Motorists should keep a careful eye as they travel past the construction at the corner of University Avenue and 100 North.
